WORKING TOGETHER TO KEEP KIDS SAFE




Stay safe.* assembly to share information with Reception to Year 6 about how they can keep themselves safe from harm and get help if they have any worries. It was a very worthwhile and empowering session for both pupils and teachers. They spoke to the children and staff about the valuable work they do across the country, and talked about how important it is for everyone in our school community to join them in their 'fight for every childhood'. Successful STEM Challenge Year 5 and 6

On Monday, Year 5 and 6 had an extremely engaging and enjoyable morning using engineering skills and Knex in a STEM challenge.

In pairs, the children had to use Knex pieces to create a moving vehicle that could hold a shoe and travel the furthest possible distance down a ramp! They were encouraged to create a quick prototype of their vehicle to trial before adjusting this to make it better using their



knowledge of different forces, especially friction, gravity and momentum. Some children even focused on the style of their vehicle, however, the main aspect was to achieve the furthest distance. The atmosphere was electric as the children were buzzing with ideas and busy creating their inventions. This quickly changed to a tense environment as the final test began...



With a variety of successful vehicles, and not so successful vehicles, there could only be one team winning... Huge

congratulations to **Abigail** and **Maya** for this successful achievement! Their vehicle reached the far end of the Juniors Hall! Talking about their success, Abigail said, "It was a team effort and I couldn't of done it without Maya!". Maya added, "I had loads of fun and I think we mastered it because we didn't focus on design; we made a light design which we think made it go further!" 


Author Visit By Amanda Miller
