On Tuesday 5th February, schools around the country were celebrating Internet Safety Day which we have focused on in our Computing sessions.

Lana - "It is important to get consent because everyone is different and some parents might allow one thing and some parents may not allow it"

The focus of this year's internet safety day is the importance of consent and gaining permission when working online ensuring that the children are aware that when using the internet, we have choices that we can make.

In Year 5, we looked at different scenarios where we ask for permission both online and offline. The children came up with a wide range of results from asking for permission to use the toilet to asking a parent to purchase an App, to asking a WhatsApp group to invite in another member, to accepting cookies on websites...the list was incredible and truly highlighted how often we have to give our consent when working online and showed how aware the children are of these different aspects. As a follow-up to this, the children created their own messenger conversation which provided an example of accepting or asking for consent. The ideas were very imaginative and the children really took on board the steps and thoughts to consider when agreeing to different things online.

This year, Internet Safety Day and week has had the focus of Our Internet, Our Choice sharing with children the variety of ways that consent is shown in the online world.

As part of this learning, Year 6 discussed the different scenarios you can have where you have to ask for permission to do something in the online world or provide your acceptance for something to be done. With their wide knowledge, the children really understood how important it is and how frequent these situations occur. Year 6 were provided with three different scripts to role play which focused on this issue. In their teams, they



had to act out their chosen script. In 6J, both groups chose the same text which involved a group of children playing a computer game when another member wanted to join.



One member didn't ask the other children's permission to join which caused an argument. Together, we discussed the safety risks involved in this new, strange being accepted. Year 6 were extremely mature when discussing these issues and I'm sure they will continue to be safe when online!

Chinese New Year - Tricky Tangrams - Year 5

To celebrate Chinese New Year, the children in Year 5 had a challenging Chinese maths puzzle to solve. Mrs Platford provided each child with a tangram. In Chinese, this is translated as "seven boards of skills" because a tangram includes seven shapes which can be placed together to create different designs.



Mrs Platford's first challenge was for the children to arrange the seven shapes to create one large square! The children were determined to solve the puzzle however, there were some frustrating screams coming from the classroom as they trialed the different arrangements and most often to start with, failed! To further the

progress, Mrs Platford gradually released some clues which spurred the children on to gain completed squares!



After this, the next challenge was for the children to create animals from the seven shapes which included a

turtle, a cat, a horse and a fish. Although this was a tricky task, the children enjoyed rising to something new and showed their perseverance; well done 5P!



Each child has been given a tangram to give to their adults at home to try...let's hope they are just as successful!

Counting in Mandarin - Year 6

To celebrate Chinese New Year, the Year 6 children had a lesson in learning how to count...in Mandarin! Mandarin is spoken by over 955 million native speakers worldwide which is more than any other language. If you were to learn Mandarin, you would have the potential to speak to over 13% of the world's total population!



Mandarin numbers work perfectly with place value. For example, if you want to say the number twenty eight, in Mandarin you would say two ten eight (two tens and eight ones). The environment was buzzing with enthusiasm and enjoyment as the children learnt aspects of a new language which made sense mathematically! Well done Year 6-by the end of the lesson, you could say a variety of numbers in Mandarin!



一 → 1 (yi)	六 → 6 (liu)
二 → 2 (er)	七 → 7 (qi)
三 → 3 (san)	八 → 8 (ba)
四 → 4 (si)	九 → 9 (jiu)
五 → 5 (wu)	十 → 10 (shi)

Using a YouTube video, the children learnt a rap to help them counting to 10. Mrs Platford also used flash cards to support the children with the English pronunciation as well as the Chinese symbol.



Having learnt the numbers up to 10, the children then had the capability to count beyond 10, up to 100, as
