G Suite for Education








We are using G Suite for Education to help enhance the way we teach and learn. It is a package of web-based services that include a similar range of tools to Microsoft's Office suite.



Teaching staff and pupils have an individual account. Logon ID for pupils are derived from their name e.g.: firstname initial.surname@bryonyschool.org.uk (unless your child has the same initials and surname as a sibling so we have allocated your child with a modified username). **No personal information whatsoever**, i.e. dates of birth, gender, addresses have been provided to Google. 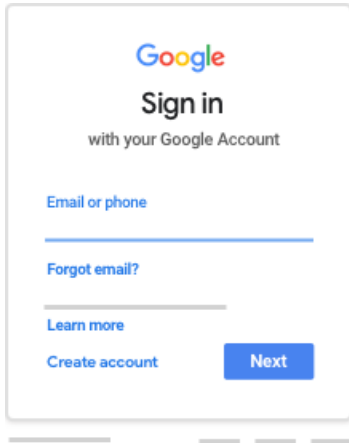
To use G suite your child will require access to a laptop, Iphone, ipad or android machine that has internet access and ideally a microphone. There are many online tools available - some of the more common tools we use are:

Name	How do I access?	What is it?
Google Drive 	drive.google.com	Cloud storage for all file types including images, videos and audio files. Students have unlimited storage and can access their files from any device, anywhere they have an internet connection.

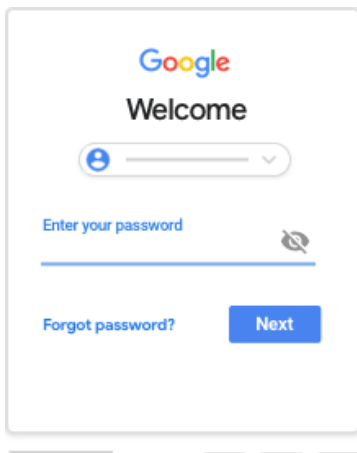
Gmail  Gmail	mail.google.com	<p>Gmail provides email storage with extra security including restricted incoming and outgoing email access. Pupils are NOT able to send and receive emails outside of our school community i.e. outside the domain 'bryonyschool.org.uk'. Staff can email outside the Bryony domain.</p>
Google Classroom 	classroom.google.com	<p>A blended learning platform that integrates Google Suite to allow teachers to assign and collect work from students. Some work has already been uploaded onto each virtual classroom.</p> <p>Classroom creates a paperless environment and saves time providing a way for teachers and students to easily communicate and stay organised. Teachers can authorise specific YouTube videos that can be watched by students as part of their learning.</p>
Google Slides 	slides.google.com	<p>Presentation tool that allows students to collaborate together on the same presentation and easily add images, videos and graphics to tell a story.</p> <p>Students can choose from templates or create their own slide format.</p>
Google Docs 	docs.google.com	<p>Word processing tool to allow students to create and edit text and paragraphs. Students can collaborate on the same document and teachers can easily provide feedback while students are working.</p>
Google Sheets 	sheets.google.com	<p>Spreadsheet tool for analysing, visualizing and charting data. Similar to the other G:Suite tools, students can easily share and collaborate in real-time.</p>
Google Calendar 	calendar.google.com	<p>Online calendar that integrates with Google Classroom to help students to be aware of assignments and/or appointments.</p>
Meet / Hangouts 	meet.google.com	<p>Video conferencing and chat facilities between staff and groups of children for lessons or between staff for meetings. Those without a bryonyschool.org.uk domain will be</p>

How to log into your child's google account:

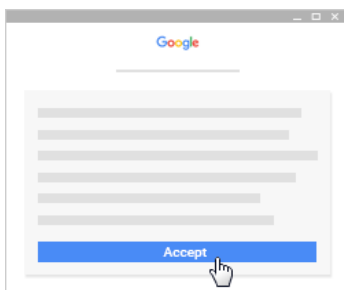
1. Go onto the website: www.google.co.uk . Top right hand corner of the screen log on.
2. Enter your username and click Next. firstname.surname@bryonyschool.org.uk (unless your child has the same initials and surname as a sibling so we have allocated your child with a modified username)



3. Enter your password and click Next.



If there is a welcome message, read it and click Accept. (those that have logged in and accepted this already will not see this)



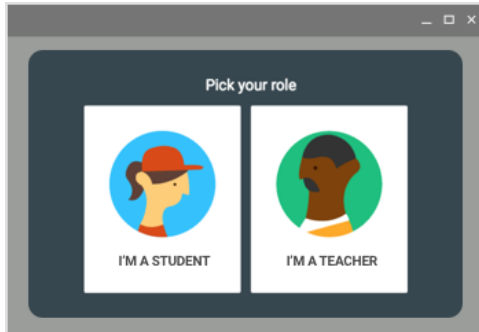
Then select one of the Google apps (see 9 dots at the top right of your screen).



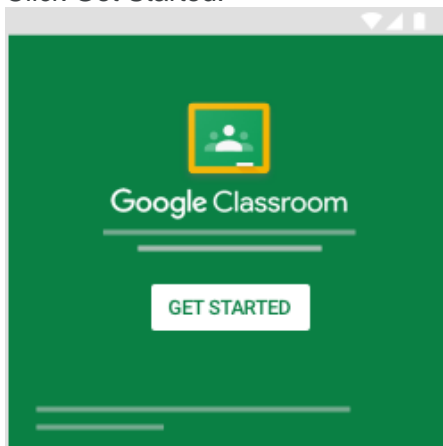
For example – **Google Classroom**
