#### **Dogs' Trust**

On Wednesday, a volunteer from the Dog Trust Company (Phil) came to visit the junior children. He brought a lovely toy dog called Lola who helped us learn how to treat dogs respectfully, how to act around dogs so that we keep both ourselves and the dog safe, and what to do to be good owners. We also learnt how Dog Trust works to help dogs get rehomed and how important they are.







We then had workshops where we got to be "Dog Detectives." The children enjoyed this immensely as they were able to immerse themselves into

different characters (human and hound) to act out possible scenarios and discuss how we can act differently to keep ourselves from getting hurt.

Amira (Y4) "We learnt about how not to make loud noises around dogs, not to pet them on the head when it is not your dog and not to touch their nose, tail and paws. It is important not to get into



the dog's face because you will look like a big, blurry monster as they are colourblind."
